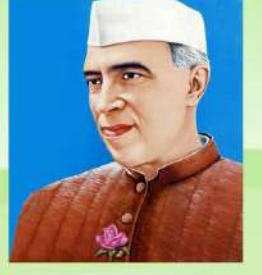

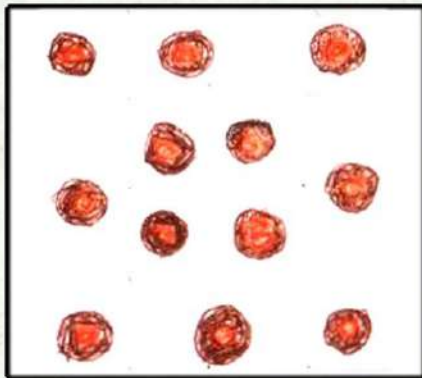

Grey eyes are determined by the number of melanin pigments in the iris and the density of proteins.

Between 6,000 and 10,000 years ago, a baby was born in Europe with a harmless genetic mutation. That little DNA blip was the blue eye colour that the researchers at the University of Copenhagen believe to be the first.

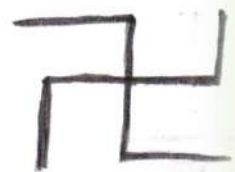

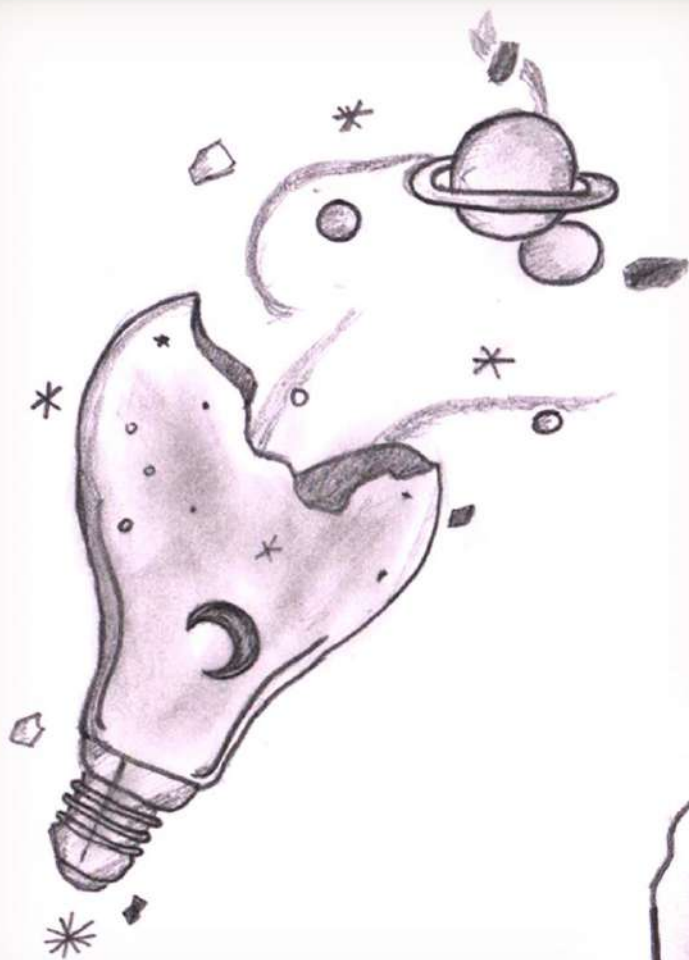

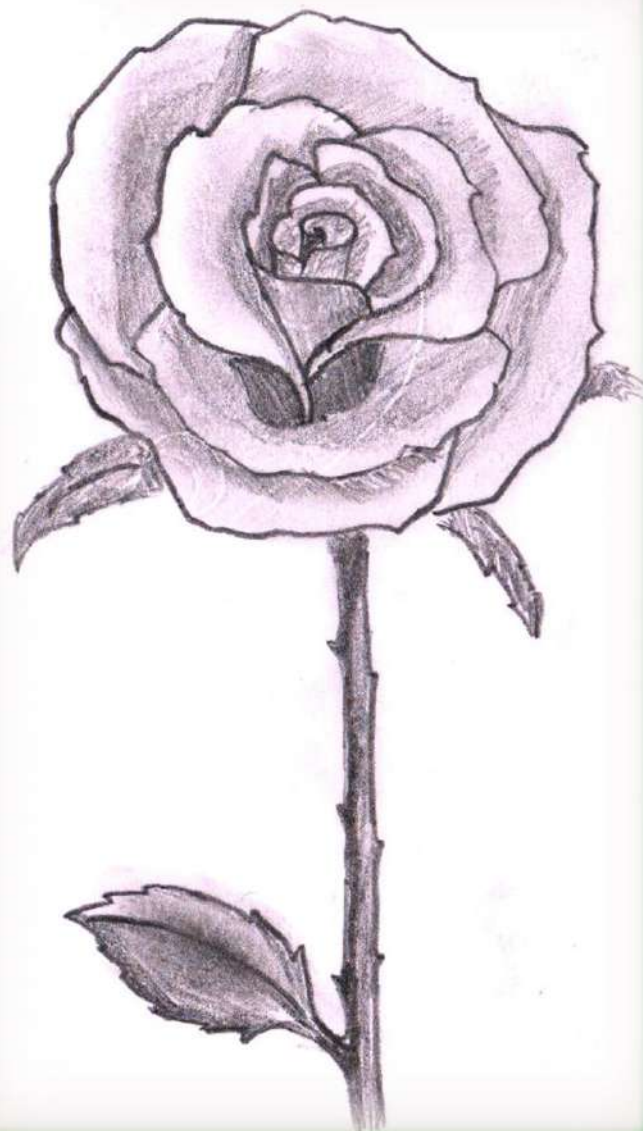

The Great Pyramid of Giza, Cairo, Egypt.

Great Pyramid of Giza is one of the largest, oldest and tallest pyramids, whose perimeter is 365.24 cubits, which is the number of days in a year; the pyramid's perimeter divided by twice its height is equal to 3.14 (pi) and king's chamber measurements are based on a Pythagorean triangle (3, 4, 5)

Taj Mahal, Agra, India

Taj Mahal is one of the greatest examples of line symmetry – with two lines, one vertically down the middle of the Taj and along the waterline, showing the reflection of prayer towers in the water.

The Eden Project, Cornwall, UK

The Eden Project consists of geodesic domes made up of hexagonal and pentagonal cells. The building has taken its inspiration from plants, using Fibonacci numbers to reflect the nature featured inside the site.
